## Dress Code Very Important! Read This!!

Hello Prom attendees, parents, and guardians:

We provide you with our dress code, (complete with pictures below), to help bridge the gap between different understandings of modest apparel. We want everyone to be able to enjoy this event so please value others above self. We want everyone to feel welcome, and comfortable to have a wonderful experience!

This is a formal event. Gentlemen should wear suits, dress pants, dress shirts and ties. Tuxedos are encouraged but not required. Please no sagging pants, open shirts, or T-shirts or jeans. Dress cowboy attire is permitted - black or dark blue jeans (no holes) or dress pants only- no washed denim. Ladies should wear formal dresses/pant suits that meet a standard of modesty. Please, no plunging necklines (even if no cleavage is showing,) 2 piece or bare midriffs, and no cut-outs or see through mesh on bodice (anywhere from how natural side arm hang lands forward.) No body-hugging "tube" dresses, please. Open back is permitted within reason. Short dresses and dresses with slits **must cover you BELOW the length of your fingertips** when your arms are down. If you are wearing a high/low hemline with a stretchy skirt piece, *please move around and/or dance when trying it on.* If it slides up higher than fingertip length, please choose something else. If you choose a strapless dress, please make sure it covers your cleavage, especially with sweetheart necklines!

By purchasing a ticket, you are agreeing to the dress code. If an attendee is turned away at the door because of dress code issues, there will be no refunds provided. Attendees who return home to make modifications to their attire may be allowed to enter if their changes bring them into compliance with the Dress Code.
